

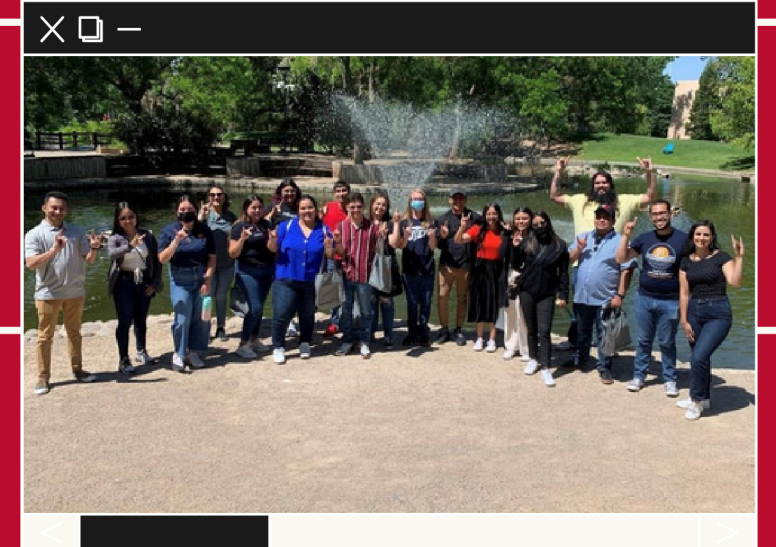
HISTORY

- In 2002, the Project for New Mexico Graduates of Color was founded by a group of UNM graduate students that recognized the need for an organization that could provide students like them with academic and emotional support to succeed in academia and beyond.
 - Since then PNMGC has grown as the only student-run and student-led program dedicated to promoting and supporting the success of graduate students of color through peer mentoring.
 - PNMGC serves all UNM students by utilizing a peer mentorship approach to create a community of support for students across diverse backgrounds, identities, and academic interests.

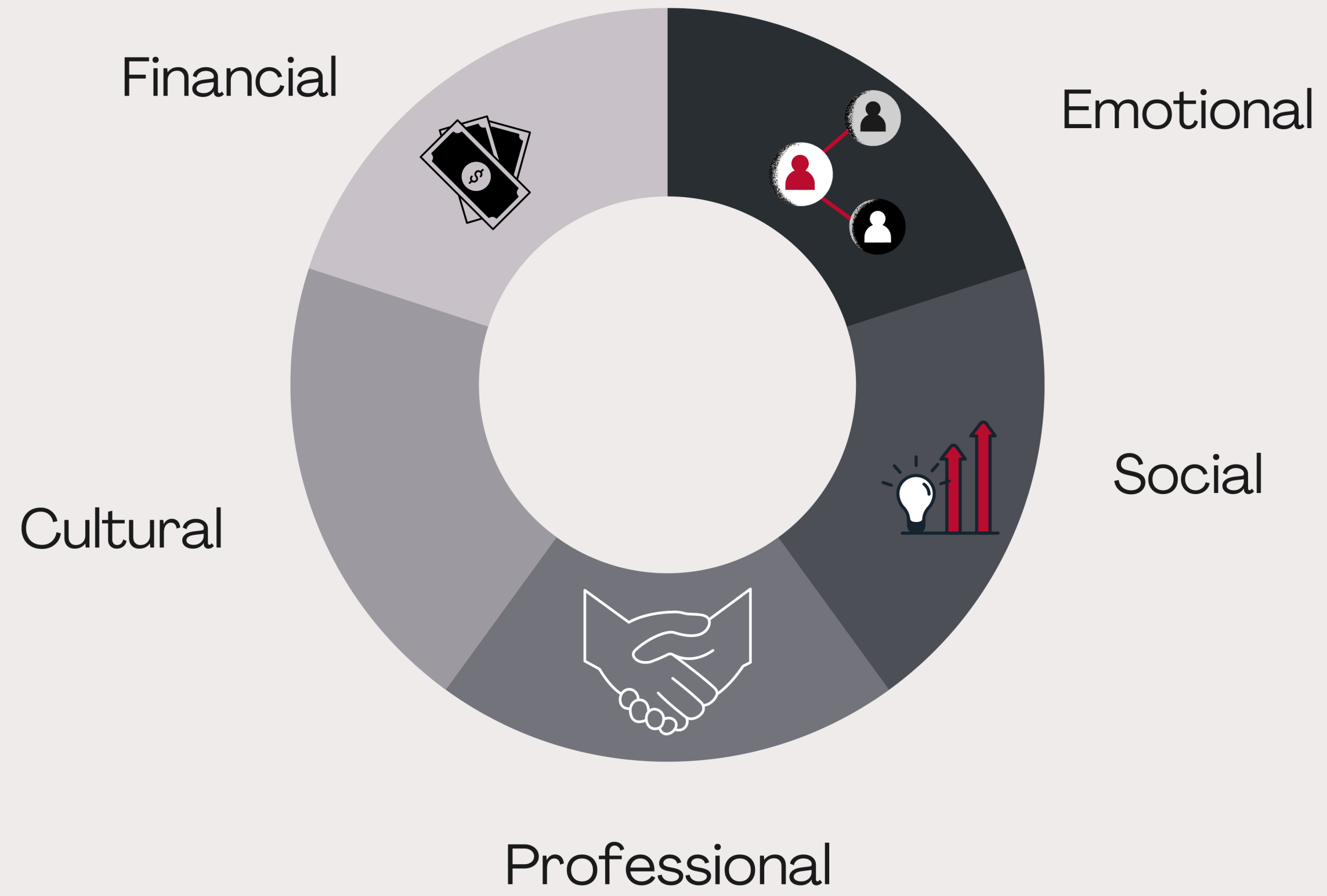
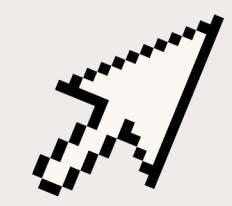


PEER MENTORING PROGRAM

- PNMGC's Mentoring Program intends to establish a relationship between peers in which concerns, issues, and experiences may be expressed.
- Pairing students together who understand the challenges of being underrepresented, they can draw upon their backgrounds and experiences to help each other succeed.
- PNMGC's method of mentoring is non-hierarchical. We work with graduates and undergraduates of varying ethnicities, races, sexual orientations, etc., and various professional mentors, faculty, staff, and programs across UNM.

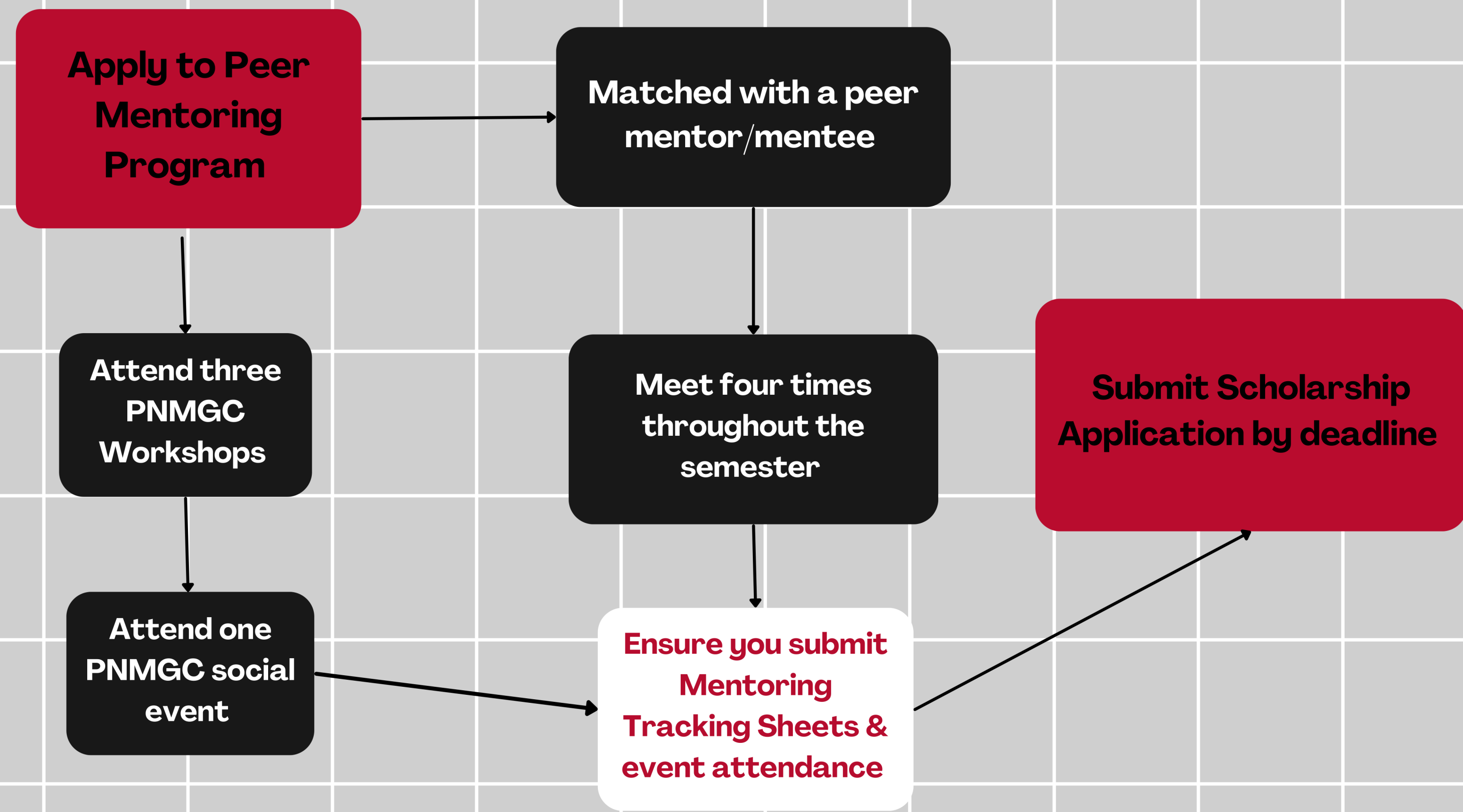


PNMGC HOLISTIC MODEL

FALL 2023 SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- ✓ Be a degree-seeking registered student at UNM
- ✓ Submit the Mentor/Mentee Application by **August 25th**
- ✓ Attend a mandatory student orientation by **September 1st**
- ✓ Attend 3 PNMGC workshops throughout the semester
- ✓ Attend 1 PNMGC social event throughout the semester
- ✓ Meet with your mentor/mentee for a minimum of one hour for 4 mentoring sessions
- ✓ Submit 4 separate Mentoring Session Tracking forms by **November 30th**
- ✓ Submit the Scholarship Application by **December 8th**
- ✓ Submit 500 word minimum reflection with Scholarship Application by **December 8th**

Requirements are subject to change each semester

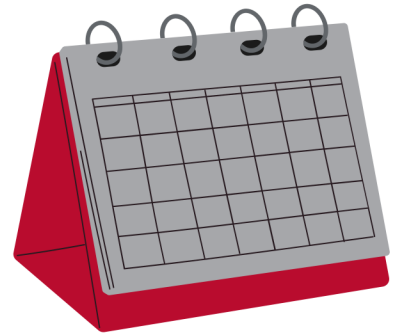
FERPA

Family Educational Rights & Privacy Act

Under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA), students have the right to inspect and review most education records maintained about them by the University of New Mexico, and, in many cases, decide if a third person can obtain information from them. Four categories of information, however, are public (or directory information) unless a student asks that some or all of that information be withheld. It is the policy of the University to comply fully and fairly with the provisions of the Act, Federal Regulations and this policy.

PEER MENTORING SESSIONS

SCHEDULE



Schedule four meetings with your mentor/mentee throughout the semester. It is important to find a day and time that will work with your schedules.

COMMUNICATION



Make sure to actively communicate with your mentor/mentee to ensure you both meet your mentoring session requirements.

TIME



We suggest you meet with your pair for a minimum one hour each month. You are welcome to meet for longer.

FORM



Every student is responsible for filling out four separate Mentoring Session Tracking Forms. It is suggested to meet each month of the semester.

IF YOUR MENTOR/MENTEE IS NOT BEING RESPONSIVE ABOUT SCHEDULING MONTHLY MEETINGS, PLEASE LET OUR TEAM KNOW AS SOON AS POSSIBLE

WORKSHOP/EVENT CHECKLIST

- Be on time for each workshop and social event
- Stay for the duration of each workshop and social event
- Be mindful that attendance will be taken at the end of each workshop/social event
- Ensure your attendance is submitted and accounted for at the time of the event
- Register for Zoom workshops in advance on our website

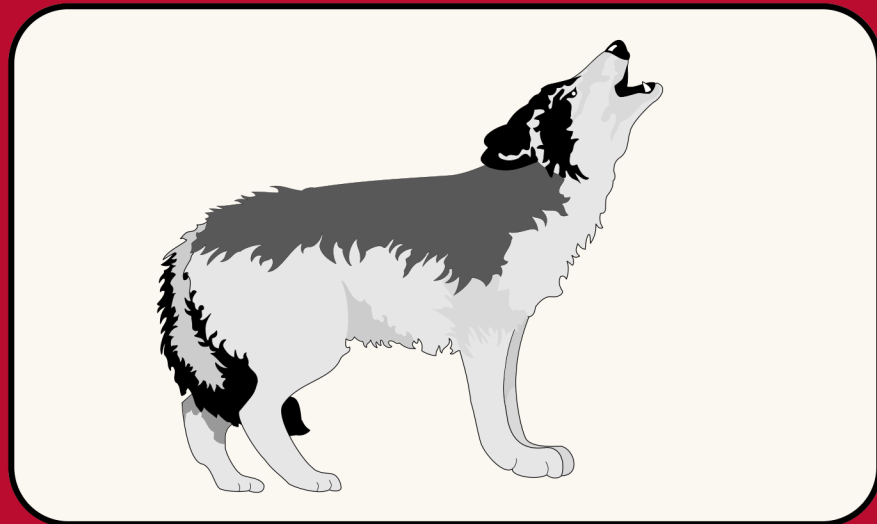

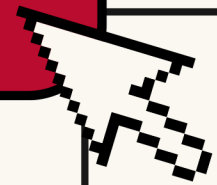
